Board Meeting December 1, 2024

Chef Roy in Rayne, La

Faye Drake called the meeting to order at 11:00am with a roll call of Chapters. Present were James Lass, CENLA; Harry Kleinman, Contraband; Wally Waguespack, Baton Rouge; Andy Slovachek, Evangeline. Lagniappe Chapter send a proxy letter in lieu of anyone attending the meeting.

The minutes of the May Semi-Annual meeting were approved with the change to “the minutes were approved from the May meeting”. It should have read “the minutes were approved from the December meeting” as printed in the Duster. Andy S. made the motion to accept the minutes with the change indicated, James L. seconded, and the motion passed.

Harry K. gave the treasurer’s report.

The Region still has \$4000 available for scholarships in the treasury but cannot find a community college that has a body shop or a car repair program that qualifies for the money. Discussion was held to research charitable organizations that would benefit from the funds we have. Or we may want to use the funds to assist if we ever have a disaster in the area. It was suggested that each chapter research the needs of their community to donate \$200 to needy veteran’s organization, church, needy family, etc. and the Region would reimburse the chapters. After debating the issue, the consensus was that if chapters would agree to donate at least \$200 per year to a charitable organization, the Region would match the \$200. The original motion was amended to say that the Region will match \$200 per year per chapter to make it a \$400 donation for approved charitable donations. Each chapter president should bring this suggestion back to their members and report back at the May semi-annual or the December meeting on how the funds were distributed. Harry Kleinman will continue as treasurer for James Lass, so he will be the one to contact for disbursement of the additional \$200 in matching funds.

Jack Wade will speak at the membership meeting about the 2025 Louisiana Tour that Horseless Carriage of New Orleans will be hosting May 2-4, 2025 in Hammond, La. **The Drive and Dine** Rotation is as follows: Lagniappe – 1st Quarter, CENLA – 2nd Quarter, Contraband – 3rd Quarter, Evangeline – 4th Quarter.

Louisiana Tour rotation is as follows: 2026 – Baton Rouge, 2027- Evangeline, 2028 -Contraband, 2029 – Lagniappe, 2030 – CENLA, 2031 – Horseless Carriage – 2031

Chapter Tour schedule is **2025** – Contraband and Lagniappe. (Horseless Carriage La Tour)

2026 – CENLA, (Baton Rouge La Tour) **2027** Lagniappe, (Evangeline La Tour)

2028 - CENLA, (Contraband La Tour)

Harry Kleinman has gathered all of the discs and thumb drives containing the Region’s history from Fred Duplechin, past Region Historian. He will continue to collect them from Historian Susan Slovachek after each President’s two-year term is up.

MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Faye called the meeting to order at 12:45pm. After the prayer and pledge, she introduced Jack Wade, Louisiana Tour Chairman from the Horseless Carriage Club of New Orleans. He went over the details of the tour which will be held May 2-4, 2025, in Hammond, La. The host hotel is the Holiday Inn and the flyer with the registration form will be included in the Jan/Feb Duster.

Harry gave the treasurer’s report. Perry Richardson made a motion to accept the treasurer’s report, Wally Waguespack seconded, motion carried.

Minutes of Meetings Continued:

Faye Drake went over the Drive and Dine rotation, the Chapter tour rotation, and the Louisiana Tour schedule.

Old Business: The committee to distribute the \$4000 set aside for scholarships to area community colleges or schools that have an automotive mechanic or paint, and body class has had problems finding a school who is interested in the funds. The board unanimously agreed that if each Chapter would donate \$200 per year to a non-profit organization of their choice, the Region would match the \$200 per chapter from the scholarship.

Herb offered suggestions on different non-profits that might benefit from the donations. Veterans Homes, veteran's organizations, church programs to help needy families, disaster relief projects. Lesia Lass suggested going to high schools in the area who might need extra funds to help keep their automotive programs active.

Faye researched whether or not non-profit organizations need to deplete their bank accounts before filing IRS Form 990. An article written by Lena Eisenstein on 501 (C)(3) organizations said that that was a fallacy. The federal government and nonprofit advocacy organization encourage nonprofits to carry a continual reserve in the interest of financial security and sustainability. Our nonprofit is operating under the rules of the IRS and need not worry about our reserve funds earmarked for distribution or future operating expenses.

CENLA President James Lass reported that other than the Drive and Dine there is nothing on the schedule but will keep the Region informed of any events that may come up.

Contraband President Harry Kleinman reported that information will be forthcoming after the first of the year on their upcoming Spring Tour scheduled for the end of March or the first of April. Larry Rewerts told the group about the chapter's commitment to ring the bell for the Salvation Army on Saturday, December 9, 2024th at the Wal-Mart in Sulphur. Chapter members will park their vehicles on the sidewalk in front of the Sulphur store and man the entire shift from 10am – 6pm. Last year the chapter collected over \$850 surpassing the previous year's collection for that Saturday by \$400. Harry reported that the Chapter had enrolled 18 new members in 2024 and credits chapter involvement in community projects and wearing club shirts to create awareness of our group.

Andy Slovachek, President of Evangeline Chapter will get the information out on their upcoming Drive and Dine and any other events that may come up. Wally Waguespack with the Baton Rouge Chapter gave a recap of the Rally they put on in September.

Faye Drake presented the Most Active Member awards to members who have attended all the point earning events for 2024 to Lesia and James Lass, Herb and Teri Comeaux, Wally and LuLu Waguespack, Harry and Karen Kleinman. Faye received the award also.

Herb Comeaux presented the Charlie Matthews Award for the best written article in the Duster. There were four articles submitted and printed in the Duster this year. Dr. Harry Kleinman submitted "Trailer Woes", Dr. Joe Richardson submitted the "New Brighton Antique Run", Ted Drott submitted "Broken Down in Who Knows Where", and Faye Drake submitted an article about the Thanksgiving Tour in 2023. An independent panel of three judges chose Dr. Richardson's "New Brighton Antique Run" article as the winner. He will keep the award plaque for one year and will return it to be awarded to next year's winner.

Faye recognized the seven past Region Presidents in attendance. After calling incoming President James Lass up, she thanked him for stepping up and accepting the nomination for the office for the next two years. She presented him with a name tag and handed over the gavel and the meeting to him.

James asked if there was any more business to discuss and Lesia Lass announced she wanted to volunteer to take Thanksgiving Tour Chairmanship for 2025. She asked for suggestions on places to go and things to see. Right now, Hot Springs has been suggested. She encouraged all members to consider taking the tour next year. Brian and Deborah Haviland and Jackie Brown and Tony King were new members who attended the tour and recommended everyone consider it next year.

Having no further business, James adjourned the meeting.

A T-BIRD LOVE AFFAIR

1956 to 1960 -- Those were my high school years. Exciting times. Rock and roll music was in its heyday. We were pioneering into space. Automobile models and styles were changing drastically. And, of course, there were those gorgeous T-Birds that made a young man's fantasy soar into the stratosphere. How I dreamed of having one!

My desire for a T-Bird was particularly peaked by the fact that the gentleman who owned the wholesale ice company where i worked part-time in my hometown of Port Arthur, Texas was the owner of not one, but two T-Birds: a white '57 with red interior and a white '58 with red interior. He frequently had me take the 'Birds to my home to wash and polish them. I used the '57 on two occasions to drive with a queen contestant sitting on the trunk area in the annual Cav-Oil-Cade parade. And then for my senior prom, he "insisted" that I use the '58 (which was the four passenger Bird) since I was double dating. I had been selected as king for the prom, but I felt even more "royal" driving that beautiful T-Bird.

Then it was on to college, Army, Vietnam, law school, marriage and children (so much for T-Birds). But, I did not lose that love and desire for those great cars. Of course, I liked many different cars. Since my earliest recollection, I was a car buff. I still recall sitting on my dad's lap at around age 4 and steering the car as we drove slowly down some seldom used road. And then there were the collections of model cars which I would play with for hours on end. However, through the years my favorite car has always been the early T-Birds.

One day in 1986 as I was driving back from court in my transplanted home of Sulphur, Louisiana, I spied a white '56 sitting on the used car lot of the Shetler Ford dealership. I whipped in immediately. It was parked there in the bright sunlight with the top removed and with (you guessed it) a red interior. The dealer was a personal friend and it didn't take long to make a deal.

Over the past 38 years, since I have owned the car, it has seen many improvements, including repainting, overhaul of the engine and transmission, and addition of air conditioning. It has been shown at events in Galveston, Dallas, San Antonio, Memphis, Miami and The Villages of Florida, as well as numerous local shows in the Lake Charles and surrounding area.

My love of the T-Birds has "forced" me to acquire three other Birds, a 1955, a 1957 and a 2002. I guess you could say that I have had a love affair with Ford T-Birds.

MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTION

POLICY:

AUTHORITY

R.S. 32:1301 - 1314

DEFINITION

The Motor Vehicle Inspection Law states that every motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer and pole trailer registered in this state shall bear a valid safety inspection certificate issued in the state of Louisiana, except as otherwise provided by R.S. 32:1311.

EXEMPTIONS

The following vehicles are exempt from obtaining a motor vehicle inspection:

- Farm tractors, self-propelled farm equipment, rubber-tired farm wagons and carts, drawn rubber-tired farm equipment, and implements of husbandry designed primarily for field use.
 - Single axle two wheel trailers
 - Boat trailers
- Motor vehicles which are twenty-five years old or older that are used primarily for exhibition in shows, parades and tours and not for general transportation and which are registered **and licensed as antique** as provided for by R.S. 32:707(L).
- Vehicles which are designed to transport more than 15 passengers: such vehicles require a commercial MVI sticker.
 - Vehicles with a GVWR of 10,000 pounds or more which are used in the transportation of hazardous materials or vehicles with a GVWR of 26,000 pounds or more. These type vehicles require a commercial MVI Sticker.
